Medicaid Administrative Claim Program Change

The state contract for the Illinois Medicaid Administrative Claim (MAC) has been recently awarded to the Public Consulting Group (PCG). For the last 10 years, Fairbanks has held the contract. Steve and Mary went to a recent training as did most of the CASE Business Managers and Student Services directors. Staff lists were imported from Fairbanks and we worked with the elementary districts to ensure that all staff were included and listed correctly. We have continued to field questions as they arise and will continue to keep current in case this changeover results in any differences in data entry or user interface.

Lead Nurses Meeting

Matt held the second lead nurses meeting on Monday. At this meeting, nurses discussed PPE training protocols and presentations, student entry screening/ self-certification, and bus protocols. These meetings have been a great opportunity for CASE cooperating districts to collaborate and share resources.

Prevention Initiative

CASE has been informed that the Birth to Three PI program will have a virtual “desk review” audit process sometime this school year. We have begun a thorough self-review matching their criteria to see where we think we stand. The Home Visitors are conducting file reviews of their own files and having a peer review as well (in addition to the ongoing, regular supervisory reviews).

CASE Itinerant Services

We are super proud to report that a GBN student, Amber, had conversation with her Case Manager to advocate that Closed Captioning would be helpful for her. The team called an IEP meeting to put this accommodation on her IEP. Way to go Amber!

Itinerants that are in buildings are reporting that students are rocking the mask policy! Additionally, we have heard positive feedback on bringing CASE self-certification documentation when entering buildings.

Spectrios held a Low Vision Clinic on 9/23, CASE had 5 students attend. The Low Vision Clinic determines if the student would benefit from low vision aids (monocular, magnifier) and they also provide glasses or rec specs (for gym class). Students and families were well received, and it was a successful event! Plus, we were the official kick off to their 30th year of having *Seeing Is Believing Clinics!*
